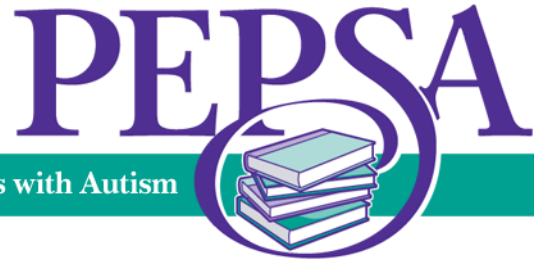

Since 1993, Diane Adreon, M.A. has served as the associate director of the University of Miami/Nova Southeastern University Center for Autism & Related Disabilities. Ms. Adreon presents and consults internationally on high-functioning autism & Asperger's Syndrome (AS). Ms. Adreon is co-author (with Myles) of *Asperger's Syndrome and Adolescence: Practical Solutions for School Success* (2001), winner of the Autism Society of America Literary Achievement Award. She is also one of the authors of *Simple Strategies that Work! Helpful Hints for All Educators of Students with High-Functioning Autism*, *Asperger's Syndrome, and Related Disabilities* (Myles, Adreon, & Gitlitz. 2006). In addition, Ms. Adreon serves on the editorial boards of *Focus on Autism and Other Developmental Disorders* and *Intervention in School & Clinic*.

Particular emphasis will focus on practical and simple strategies to help you create successful experiences for students with high-functioning autism spectrum disorders, whether at school, home, or in the community.
