## About PEPSA

The Partnership Program is designed to provide training and technical assistance to educators, paraprofessionals, ESE administrators, or other school personnel (e.g., cafeteria staff, bus attendants, therapists, counselors, etc.) of school programs that aim to enhance the educational experience for students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Each partner will be matched to a Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (CARD) professional who will mentor, provide support, resources, technical assistance, and training that is specific to the needs identified by the educator or school staff, to develop a plan for implementing innovative and effective practices within their school programs for students with ASD.

The Partnership for Effective Programs for students with Autism (PEPSA) project is 100% percent funded by the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services of the U.S. Department of Education as part of an award totaling \$357,860 with 0% percent financed from non-governmental sources.

Designed to enhance the capacity of Florida teachers to provide quality educational programs to students with autism spectrum disorder.

- ➤ In order to participate in the second year leadership track, applicants are required to have successfully completed one year of the Partnership Program as a first year participant and must receive a nomination from their assigned CARD staff.

- There must be a commitment by the teacher or school staff to the enhancement of practices or school components that are provided to students with ASD.
