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Where Do You Think You're Going? The Analysis and Treatment of Wandering and Elopement in School Settings

## **Training Description**

**Target Audience:** (Mental/Behavioral health therapists/providers, Educators, Clinicians, and Professionals)

There are many problems that arise in educational settings. General classroom management problems, behavior problems, curriculum problems and acquisition problems to name just a few. One major problem in classrooms everywhere is that students are not occupying the space they're supposed to occupy! This category of problems is a symptom of other related problems that have not been addressed. The presentation will provide an in-depth look at elopement (out of room/setting), wandering (aimlessly within room/setting, not engaging), out of area (staying in place, but the student is not where they should be), and out of seat problems. The presentation will also provide areas to focus on to alleviate these problems, based on the most likely maintaining variables and/or skill deficits.

## **Training Objectives**

Participants will be able to:

- Describe the most important differences between elopement, wandering and out of area behavior
- Describe one quick method to reduce TAFT (Time Away from Task)
- Explain the difference between local and distant rates of reinforcement and how this may affect elopement, wandering and out of area problems.
