Program for the Education and Enrichment of Relational skills PEERS® is an evidence-based treatment program developed by UCLA to teach adolescents with ASD how to make and keep friends. Topics that are addressed over the course of treatment include: conversational skills, finding common interests, reciprocal conversation, nonverbal communication, electronic communication, safety, choosing friends, extracurricular activities, appropriate use of humor, gettogethers, good sportsmanship, peer rejection, teasing & bullying, changing a bad reputation, and peer conflict.

Training Objectives

Participants will be able to consider, identify, and implement:

- Participants will demonstrate understanding of the PEERS model, the evidence supporting the model, and the benefit for adolescents with ASD.
- Participants will be provided the instruction and support to implement the PEERS model in the educational setting.
- Participants will receive instruction on how to implement both daily and weekly PEERS lesson formats.
