### About the Presenter

**Carol Schall, PhD**, is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Special Education and Disability Policy and the Director of the Virginia Autism Resource Center. She has over twenty years of experience supporting adolescents and adults with ASD as a teacher, group home supervisor, administrator, and consultant. She was honored by TASH in 2005 with their Positive Approaches Award for exemplary support of people with disabilities through the use of positive behavior support. She has authored multiple articles and book chapters focusing on the needs of young adults with ASD. Her research interests include transition from school to work and adult life, psychotropic medication management and monitoring for individuals with ASD, and training for parents and professionals serving individuals with ASD.

This workshop will provide information on how to assist middle and high school aged youth with ASD in the transition from school to adulthood.
