Training Description

Target Audience: (Teachers of Students with ASD and Support Staff)

7/25-26 Two-day ASD Boot Camp

This day is designed for those new to the ASD classroom or those wanting to improve their current classroom to meet the needs of students with ASD. Topics covered will include Best Practices for design and implementation of programs for ASD, including: Structuring the Environment for Success, Scheduling, Evidence Based Instructional Formats and Data Collection, Managing the Classroom, and Supporting Students with ASD in General Education.

7/27 Working with Challenging Learners

This day will focus on reaching students who have communication profiles and identifying functional curriculum and approaches for students with autism profiles. Evidence based practices will be demonstrated and teachers will work in small groups to analyze their program for opportunities to increase communication and functional skill use as a function of the students IEP. Teachers are asked to bring a COPY of the IEP from 3 of their 2021-22 students with them to this day.

7/28 Social Skills and Emotional Regulation for Students with ASD

This day will highlight some social thinking strategies, curriculum emphases, and activities that can be done to promote social skills and emotional regulation for verbal students with ASD who may spend some or all of their day in general education curriculum. It will culminate with a panel of students and parents talking about their experiences with social interactions at school and their advice for teachers who are supporting this population.
