Target Audience: (Teachers of Students with ASD and Support Staff)

Students in special education require a well-structured classroom environment with consistent, evidence-based instruction that is informed by data collection. Using the structure of the Teaching Implementation Plan (TIP), starting with the individual students' TIPs as the base, participants will learn methods for organizing the classroom environment, schedule, and staff to maintain high levels of engagement, using evidence-based interventions. Throughout the session, questions will be answered, pictures and videos shared, and feedback from the audience will guide the discussion. Forms will be available to the participants online, and examples will be shared in the presentation. Participants will work on segments of Teaching Implementation Plans, schedules, classroom visions and zoning plans throughout the session.

Training Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Access a format for planning instruction and data collection across the day.
- Identify methods to build classroom teams to be productive and efficient.
- Use strategies for appropriate physical arrangement to maximize student participation and progress.
- Design classroom schedules and staff zoning plans to maximize engagement and provide individualized instruction to the students.
- Differentiate evidence-based strategies for teaching students with ASD.
- Discuss and share strategies that will lead to high levels of engagement.
