- Evidence-based instructional formats and data collection
- Managing the classroom
- Promoting communication
- An overview of ASD

Presenters have all had experience as current or former teachers and will provide practical information for getting the class off to a good start.

- Become familiar with evidence-based instructional practices for students with ASD.
