Training Description

Students in special education require a well-structured classroom environment with consistent, evidence-based instruction that is informed by data collection. Using the structure of the Teaching Intervention Plan (TIP), this presentation will start by crafting classroom-friendly goals and objectives. Starting with the individual students' TIPs as the base, participants will learn methods for organizing the classroom environment, schedule, and staff to maintain high levels of engagement. Finally, methods for setting up data collection systems to evaluate the impact of the classroom activities will be discussed.

- Identify methods to build classroom teams to be productive and efficient in their implementation of planned instruction across the day.
- Use strategies for appropriate physical arrangement of the classroom environment to maximize student participation and allow independent and group work.
- Design classroom schedules and staff zoning plans to maximize engagement of students and provide individualized instruction to students.
