Dr. Pritchard has also served as president of the Association for Science in Autism Treatment, has served on the executive council of the Association for Behavior Analysis International, and was a member of the Supervision Task Force of the Behavior Analyst Certification Board.

The PEAK Relational Training System in an evaluation and curriculum guide for teaching basic and advanced language skills from a contemporary behavior analytic approach. It differs from traditional verbal behavior (VB) approaches in that it specifically evaluates and teaches children the relation and complex repertoires needed to respond to their world with meaning and understanding. This program was designed for teachers in public school settings; don't let the behavior analysis approach scare you away!
