About the Presenter

Dr. Jennifer Kurth is an assistant professor of special education at the University of Kansas. Her academic interests include methods of implementing inclusive education, methods of embedding critical instruction within the context and routines of general education, as well as methods of providing appropriate supports and services for individual learners. Dr. Kurth's research also examines how teacher, student, and family interactions support and/or constrain learning and socialization in general education classrooms. She also studies how teacher candidates develop their dispositions and skills in inclusive practices.

The presentation will include the values, practices, and policies that guide implementation of inclusive services and will focus on strategies for teachers to use in schools and classrooms.
