Many of the featured resources are in Spanish as well as English. Featured: Simplified, specialized CBT worksheets, anime emotion cards and coloring sheets, simple CBT for kids videos, common ground conversation prompts based on Venn diagrams, and illustrated eBook on personal space. The resources presented are targeted for verbal, cooperative children age 7 to 18.
